Summary:

I joined the U.S. Army at the age of 18 and received an Honorable Discharge with the rank of E-5 and then served eight years as a police officer where I earned a B.A. in Criminal Justice. I was then recruited into the Armored Car industry where I earned a Master's in Management and served 26 years (22-Brinks' and 4-Loomis) with a total of 20-years in the senior level positions of Area General Manager, District Manager and Regional Director/Regional Vice President with full P&L responsibility ranging from \$40 to \$100 million. Direct Reports Included: Loss Prevention Managers, Human Resource Managers, Account Executives, Branch Managers, Controllers, District Managers, Transportation Managers, Coin Managers, Currency Processing Managers, ATM Managers, and Training Managers.

During my 26 years working in the cash-in-transit industry, I was responsible for managing and protecting assets at 50 high risk facilities, several thousand armed guards and 1,000 armored vehicles. It is this profit and loss experience that has helped me to understand the importance of balancing profit with risk management while recommending cost effective security measures to mitigate risk.

Since 2008, I have served as an expert witness within the security industry, retained by both defense and plaintiff attorneys and organizations in the U.S., Canada and South America to provide expert opinions in security cases pending litigation.

I am vetted as a Security Contractor for the U.S. Department of State Anti-terrorism Administration Assistance (ATA) Program to train law enforcement officers, military and private security professionals in developing countries for the following courses: Critical Infrastructure Security and Resilience; Preventing Attacks on Soft Targets; Surveillance Detection, Instructor Development Course and Preventing Terrorist Attacks on Bus and Railway Systems.

Since 2012, I have trained military and police agencies for the following countries, many on multiple occasions: Afghanistan, Egypt, Columbia, Jordan, Mexico, India, Tajikistan, Uganda, Pakistan, Philippines, Tunisia, Jamaica, Chad, Niger, Mauritania, India, Yemen, Saudi Arabia Kingdom. I have served as Lead Instructor for ATA courses in Pakistan, Jordan, Afghanistan, Chad, India, Bangladesh, Mexico City and Uganda.

As part of the ATA Program, I have supervised security risk assessments in the aforementioned parts of the world at the following facilities: Water Treatment Plant, Railway Stations, Bus Terminals, Electric Power Plants, Hotels, Mall (13 stories), Hospital, Sports Stadium, Secretariat of Energy facility, Secretariat of Interior facility, Military Training Centers, Department of Interior Facility, National Police Headquarters, a Government School (ages 5-18), Mosque, Churches, National Art Museum, Airport, a police college and various other government facilities.

Certifications:

A Board Certified Designation is acknowledged as the security profession's highest recognition of practitioners. Rather than the individual stating qualifications on a CV or resume, the individual's experience and education are verified and reviewed by a professional board of his peers and once qualified, the candidate is tested in the area of expertise selected and must receive a passing score. Testing is monitored under camera and with supervisory personnel present at all times.

The CPP®, PSP® and PCI® certifications are awarded based upon experience, education and examination that provides objective measure of an individual's broad-based knowledge and competency in security management, physical security and the investigation process. Ongoing professional development is required to maintain each credential.

The CPP®, PSP® and PCI® are administered by ASIS International, the preeminent international organization for security professionals, with 38,000 members worldwide which Jim has been an active member since 1981.

These certifications are accredited by ANSI under the ISO 17024 Standard. In addition, and have been awarded the DHS's SAFETY Act Designation, which gives ASIS board-certified professionals, their employers, and their customers immediate protection from lawsuits involving ASIS certification and the ASIS certification process that arise out of an act of terrorism.

Finally, ASIS participates in the ACE College Credits program, which allows those with an ASIS credential to gain college credits from participating universities and colleges.

Certified Protection Professional (CPP®) – This certification designates individuals who have demonstrated competency in all areas constituting security management.

Physical Security Professional (PSP®) – The PSP® designation is the certification for those whose primary responsibility is to conduct threat surveys, design integrated security systems that include equipment, procedures and people, or install, operate and maintain those systems.
